A mission is a portfolio of actions across disciplines intended to achieve a **an inspirational and measurable goal** within a set timeframe, with **impact** for society and policy making.

CO-PROGRAMMED

Based on Memoranda of Understanding/contractual arrangements; implemented independently by the partners and by Horizon Europe


CO-FUNDED

Based on a joint programme agreed and implemented by partners; commitment of partners for financial and inkind contributions

INSTITUTIONALISED

Based on long-term dimension and need for high integration; partnerships based on Art 185/187 of TFEU and the EIT legal acts for 2021-2027





COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS

Third countries* (not low to middle-income countries) <u>are not</u> <u>automatically eligible for funding</u>. Exceptional funding, if:

the country is <u>explicitly identified in the call</u> for eligibility for funding
their <u>participation as a beneficiary is essential</u> for the project.



Legal entities <u>forming a consortium</u> should include:

- at least one independent legal entity established in a Member State; and
- at least two other independent legal entities, each established in different Member States or Associated Countries.

* (neither EU Member States nor associated)
